NJDEP Fire Ban in Effect throughout the State

As we head into the fall holiday season, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) has issued a statewide fire ban due to extreme fire risk. To ensure a safe and festive season for all, it is essential that residents adhere to this ban and take precautions to prevent wildfires.

Fire Ban Restrictions:

- No outdoor fires are permitted unless they are contained in an elevated stove using only propane, natural gas, or electricity. This includes bonfires and residential fire pits.
- Wood or charcoal fires are strictly prohibited, and the use of kerosene or gas torches is also banned.
- **No fireworks** are allowed during this period, as they present a significant fire hazard.
- The fire ban applies to both **public lands and private properties** in all municipalities throughout the state.

We urge all residents to share this important information with friends, family, and neighbors to help keep our communities safe.

Preventing Wildfires: Safety Tips:

Most wildfires can be prevented by following some simple safety practices:

- **Properly dispose of smoking materials**—do not discard cigarettes, matches, or smoking materials on the ground.
- Use indoor wood stoves and fireplaces carefully—embers can escape and cause fires. Be sure to fully douse ashes with water before disposal.
- Park vehicles in safe areas—hot exhaust systems can ignite dry vegetation if parked on or over it.
- **Be cautious with yard tools**—lawnmowers and chainsaws can spark fires when cutting dry grass or leaves.
- Keep matches and lighters away from children to prevent accidental fires.
